

Belgium = 1 country, 3 districts







A partnership, a non-profit organization, a label





Public-Private Partnership signed on 2016 in order to fight against incivility and littering that undermine public cleanliness



A structure active in Wallonia since April 2016 - with the status of private non-profit organization created by Fost Plus, Comeos and Fevia.





Fost Plus is the organization that supports the promotion, coordination and financing of selective collection, sorting and recycling of household packaging waste in Belgium.



Comeos Wallonie, regional section of Comeos for Wallonia, is the federation of trade and services in Wallonia.



FEVIA Wallonie, the Walloon regional wing of FEVIA, is the Food Industry Federation.





Objectives and Ambitions

- An approach targeting litter and illegal dumpsites
- 7 Improvement of public space
- 7 A real change in behavior
- Consistency of actions on the territory
- Collaboration with stakeholders who participate in improving public cleanliness



Together for a cleaner Wallonia!

A 5-year strategic plan

Be WaPP develops and implements a large action plan articulated around 4 challenges:

- > expertise and knowledge management,
- > synergies to be developed in different themes with multiple players,
- behavior change including awareness, education and repression,
- circular economy aimed at maximum recovery of waste from public spaces.







A data culture for the actions

- FixMyStreet
- Connected bins
- Digital citizen participation process
- Video Surveillance
- Prof. exchange platform for environmental incivility
- Project registration platform
- Exchange platform for municipalities
- App PROpreté
- App to measure littering





Cleanup Days

Big citizen mobilization (4 days) in order to make the living spaces and the daily environment cleaner.

Organized since 2015

- **7** + 160,000 participants
- 500 tons of waste collected
- → 86,000 bags collected
- → 16,000 km travelled
- decrease in the tons of waste collected in 5 years



Cleanliness Ambassador

By registering, the Ambassador signs a Charter of Commitment, chooses the area he wishes to keep clean and receives materials to take action.

- 7 27,000 ambassadors
- **7** + 4,000 teams







Some examples of citizen participant actions

River Cleanup

The citizen decide **to clean the rivers**Start in 2020.

- 500 participants
- 4,7 tons of waste collected
- 793 km of rivers cleaned




Collecting cans for a financial incentive

A 2-year **pilot project** carried out in 19 Walloon municipalities (end June 2021)

The objective is to be able to **test the potential for improving public cleanliness** via a financial incentive (0,05€ / can) applied to cans from littering.

- 7 2,400 participants
- 2.800.000 cans collected
- ! Difficult distinction between picked up cans and home cans


Why use this app?

- ✓ Smartphone application, public website and a backoffice available free of charge to all municipalities
- ✓ Reports are centralized in a single platform
- ✓ The municipality decides when it whishes to share the application with its citizens

Steps of implementation









Use Case





Key figures



- **2,650** users
- 47 organizations
- 16 municipalities share with citizens sinds June 2020
- **6,690 reports** with :
 - > 5,359 reports of cleanliness categories (= **80,1%**)
 - > 2,209 reports of cleanliness categories in 16 municipalities share with citizens
 - > 1,690 reports treated of cleanliness categories in 16 municipalities share with citizens (= 76,5%)
 - ➤ 4 reports/day reports treated of cleanliness categories in 1 year for the 16 municipalities share with citizens
